The April program will be presented on April 8, 2014. The topic is Arab Spring and Its Future. The speaker is Dr. Hayrettin Yucesoy, Associate Professor of Arabic & Islamic Studies, Department of Jewish, Islamic, and Near Eastern Languages and Cultures (JINELC), Washington University, St. Louis, MO.

Dr. Yucesoy will discuss the evolution of the Arab Spring and the situation in Syria within the context of Middle Eastern as well as international politics.
