Mary M. Kogut, MBA, BSW, is President and CEO of Planned Parenthood of the St. Louis Region and Southwest Missouri, a 501 C3 health care organization serving over 45,000 clients annually. Ms. Kogut is also President and CEO of Advocates of Planned Parenthood, the advocacy arm of the affiliate.

Roe v Wade's 44 anniversary is January 2017. Planned Parenthood turned 100 in October 2016. Yet the state of reproductive health care, particularly for women, is still in question both nationally and internationally. Ms. Kogut will explore the experience of women and families worldwide and the hope of the future.
