## **PRESIDENTS' LETTER**

The start of a new branch year is a time to think about goals and priorities that will guide our branch in 2015-16. The advancement of equity for women and girls is paramount. The program planning meeting in June decided on several monthly programs that will focus on such issues as women in the state legislature, women veterans, women senior citizens, women African-American authors, and STEM education for women.

We continue our efforts to increase our membership with meet and greet events, tables at the Ferguson Farmers' Market, literature at gift wrapping, excellent publicity by Sylvia Miller, and more. Increasing our visibility at public events makes people aware of who we are and can attract potential members.

The new Diversity committee is designed to attract new members from different parts of the community. The survey from AAUW national that some of us answered this spring identifies several categories of diversity, not just the need for racial diversity that we are so aware of. Some others include gender, age, sexual orientation, educational levels, income, and ability/disability. Our committee is just getting started; it will be interesting to see what develops.

We will continue to work to promote STEM for girls and women. Serving as mentors in the Robotics program offered by PAKT is an important part of this. We are also starting to explore the Tech Savvy program. Tech Savvy events are intense one-day programs for girls and parents. A branch applies to national for a grant, partners with a college or university, and arranges for multiple speakers and programs that inform girls and parents about the opportunities in Tech fields. A branch committee is now being formed. It will investigate exactly what this project would involve and determine if we should apply for the grant next summer, to develop a Tech Savvy event in summer 2017.

"All work and no play . . ." Not everything we do is deadly serious. Several traditional fun events are planned, although even they may touch on the priorities mentioned above. The September reception to kick off the year is always fun. Carolyn is hard at work arranging the entertainment for the holiday event, the Game Day in January is lots of fun as well as being a fund raiser, and the May Luncheon is the highlight of the year.

## **PUBLIC POLICY**

**Women's Equality Day History by Shirley Breeze**

August 26, 2015, marks the 95<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of women winning the vote (August 26, 1920) the reason we celebrate Women's Equality Day. The massive, peaceful civil rights movement by women that had its beginnings in 1848 at the world's first women's rights convention, in Seneca Falls, NY, finally resulted in the passage of the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the Constitution. This effort was led by brave suffragists such as Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Lucy Stone, Susan B. Anthony, Ida B. Wells, Carrie Chapman Catt, Alice Paul, and many others. Fifteen states and territories granted women the vote before the US did: Wyoming, Utah, Colorado, Idaho, Washington, California, Kansas, Oregon, Arizona, Montana, Nevada, New York, South Dakota, Michigan, and Oklahoma. Missouri is recognized as being where the first woman voted

after passage of the Amendment. Five days after the Amendment officially became law, on August 31, 1920, Marie Ruoff Byrum voted in a special election to fill an alderman's seat in Hannibal. The Susan B. Anthony giving women the right to vote took 72 years.

With the hard work of Rep. Bella Abzug, in 1971 the US Congress designated August 26 as Women's Equality Day.

The 95<sup>th</sup> Anniversary begins the start of the big celebration leading up to the centennial celebration in 2020. Several special activities are planned for that year, including putting a woman on the \$10 bill and getting equal representation for women in legislatures across the country. It would also be an opportune time to re-visit the statues and other recognitions of women across Missouri and initiate new ones.
