So it was page one news when President Trumps administration released a scientific report that calls "human activity the dominant driver of global warming." (Post Dispatch Nov. 4) The government's legally mandated National Climate Assessment predicts sea levels rising up to 8 feet by the year 2100. Although some scientists suggested that the administration might refuse to publish this report, which contradicts Trump policy decisions, David Fahey, a lead author of the report and an atmospheric scientist with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, has said, "I'm quite confident to say there has been no political interference in the scientific messages from this report."

# **AAUW FUNDRAISING**

The major fundraising activity by AAUW's National organization centers around AAUW Fund; Legal Advocacy Fund is also a primary focus of funding. AAUW Fund is primarily used for operations at the National level; i.e., printing, travel, salaries. These are activities that keep the organization moving and keep it vibrant and relevant.

The fundraising activities are on a calendar year basis; therefore, on December 31 of each year, each branch's contributions are calculated.
