## PUBLIC POLICY by Judy Holmes, Public Policy Chair, Ferguson Florissant Branch

AAUW is a leader in the fight to end wage discrimination and open doors for women in the workplace. Despite come advancements, workplace discrimination still exists. Typically, women who work full time take home 80 cents for every dollar a full time male worker earns. Over a 47 year career, women's total estimated earnings loss compared with men is \$700,000 for a high school graduate, 1.2 million for a college graduate and 2 million for a professional school graduate.

Olivia Guerrieri, Advocacy Assistant at National AAUW, recently shared advocacy pans that list all equal pay day dates for 2019.

Tuesday, April 2: all women's Equal Pay Day (Women overall v. Men overall, \$0.80)

Tuesday, March 5: **Asian American Women's Equal Pay Day** (Asian women v. White, non-Hispanic Men, \$0.85)

Friday, April 19: **white women's equal pay day** (White, non-Hispanic women v. White, non-Hispanic men, \$0.77)

Thursday, August 22: **Black women's equal pay day** (Black women v. White, non-Hispanic men, \$0.61)

Monday, September 23: **Native Women's Equal Pay Day** (Native women v. White, non-Hispanic men, \$0.58)

Wednesday, November 20: **Latinas' Equal Pay Day** (Latinas v. White, non-Hispanic men, \$0.53) **Mom's Equal Pay Day** will be determined at a later date.

AAUW's national website will be updated to reflect these dates soon, but in the meantime you are welcome to share this information with anyone who's interested.

For further information on the gender pay gap, the AAUW publication "The Simple Truth about the Gender Pay Gap" is an excellent resource.
