PUBLIC POLICY by Shirley Breeze NATIONAL WOMEN'S HISTORY MUSEUM

The effort to establish an actual building to feature women's history began more than two decades ago when a group of women were appalled that the Portrait Monument was found relegated to the basement of the US Capitol. The Portrait Monument is officially Portrait Monument to Lucretia Mott, Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Susan B. Anthony or The Woman Suffrage Statue. It arrived in the Capitol on February 10, 1921, a gift from the National Woman's Party.

The first task of this group of women was to get the statue moved to the Rotunda. After that was accomplished, the women determined that what was really needed was an actual building to house women's history. Thus, the movement began.

Legislation has been filed for several years to accomplish this. The most recent was filed on April 1, 2019, by Sens. Collins and Feinstein.

This museum would be on the National Mall under the auspices of the Smithsonian. The total cost would be from private donations. Federal funds would be used for the planning, design, and operation of the Museum.

The mission statement: Our mission is to tell the stories of women who transformed our nation. We will do that through a growing state-of-the-art online presence and a future physical museum to educate, inspire, empower, shape the future, and provide a complete view of American history.
