FEBRUARY BRANCH MEETING

The February Branch Meeting was held on February 16 via Zoom. In addition to branch members, we were joined by several members of IBC branches, making a substantial group. The program, on the challenges of teaching music during the pandemic, was presented by Jeanine York Garesche and Daniel Shavers. Ms. Garesche teaches clarinet to individual students ranging in age from 9

to adulthood. She discussed the changes in her teaching methods when working virtually with a student rather than face to face. Mr. Shavers is a middle school band teacher who has not met with his students in person since March of 2020. He talked about the challenges of working with students virtually and demonstrated several music programs on the computer that help him work with his students.

Public Policy-Diversity Committee Report

Thanks again for giving me the opportunity to serve as the chair for the Public Policy-Diversity Chair. To help me understand my duties and roles serving as the chair, I attended webinars and consulted with Judy Holmes (Ferguson-Florissant) and Karen Francis (Ballwin-Chesterfield) Branches

During the month of February, there were webinars presented by National in reference to public policy initiatives and diversity for the year 2021.

On February 2, 2021, the webinar on public policy "AAUW Public Policy Talks: 2021 Priorities and the New Administration "was presented by national staff members. Every two years, AAUW members vote and adopt revisions to the Public Policy Priorities. The comment period for proposed changes closed on February 5, 2021 for any proposed changes and the changes will be voted on this spring by every member.

The revisions will pertain to and support our main three initiatives. The initiatives are refinement and added specificity regarding AAUW's commitment to addressing systemic racism, refinement of our commitment to equitable access to higher education for all and emphasis on the importance of high-quality data collection. On February 11, 2021, the webinar on diversity, Creating a Diversity Structure and Planning for Success" was presented by national staff members and a member from one of the Florida branches. This webinar was followed up from the webinar introducing the Diversity Toolkit.

The webinar shared the need for a diversity officer but if you do not have a diversity officer have a Diversity and Inclusion Committee. The D & I Committee should create a plan, establish a scope, preform an environmental scan, determine timelines, have appropriate materials and plan activities. To shore up everything I learned from attending the seminars, I talked to Judy Holmes and Karen Francis. Judy stated we have a D & I committee which is combined with the Public Policy Committee. I would like to reconvene this committee and add new members, if possible. Judy will provide additional information to help with the success of this committee, again.

The Tubman plan is named after abolitionist, Harriet Tubman. Harriet Tubman's face will replace Andrew Jackson's face on the \$20.00 bill.
