BARBARA LACKRITZ AWARD

The Barbara Lackritz Award is given annually by the St. Louis Interbranch Council (IBC) to an outstanding AAUW branch member. It is presented at the annual Spring Fling. Historically there has been a single honoree. Beginning in 2022, each branch may choose to give the award to one of its members. This will allow more outstanding members to be recognized and reduce the sense of competition among branches.

The purpose of the Lackritz Award is to recognize the branch member who:

- 1. Upholds the mission to advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education, and advocacy.
- 2. Provides service to AAUW at any of the local, state, or national level(s).
- 3. Provides leadership to AAUW at any of the local, state, regional, or national level(s).
- 4. Provides service and leadership in non-AAUW areas in the community, religious, professional and/or political arenas.

If Ferguson-Florissant branch chooses to present a Lackritz Award, the first step is for any branch member(s) to submit a nominee's name to President Pam Meyers **by October 15**. If there is more than one nominee, the president will appoint a committee (not including any nominee) to select the member who will receive the award. There is a form called "IBC Barbara Lackritz AAUW Award Program Sheet Insert" which spells out ways a nominee fulfills each of the 4 points listed under Purpose above. The committee may consider such forms for each nominee in selecting the Lackritz honoree for the branch.

This selection process should be completed by early November because the name of the branch honoree along with a completed form must be turned in at the November IBC meeting on the 4th Tuesday in November.

If you would like to nominate a branch member for the Barbara Lackritz Award, submit her name to Pam Meyers by October 15, 2021.
