I sincerely hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season with their families. As you hang your new calendar for the year 2022 and make a note of special holidays, you will probably notice a special holiday that is not on your calendar. The holiday is Juneteenth.

Juneteenth received its name by combining June and 19. On June 19, 1865, about two months after Confederate Robert E. Lee surrendered, a U.S. general went to Texas where slavery had remained in effect to inform enslaved African Americans of their freedom and the end of the Civil war.

It has grown popular over the years and is celebrated with a host of activities from backyard fun to recognition from Congress and the President. On June 17, 2021 it became the 11<sup>th</sup> national holiday recognized by the government. The Senate passed it on June 15, 2021 and the House approved the next day. President Biden signed the bill into law the day after that, immediately giving federal employees the day off this year. Some businesses have moved toward marking it as a company holiday giving their employees a paid day off. Some of the companies are Twitter, Square, N.F.L., Best Buy, Nike and Target. A total of 49 states and the District of Columbia have moved to officially recognize the day.

Our next DEI-Public Policy meeting is presently being scheduled for the month of March 2022 and I will try my best to give as much notice about the meeting. It will probably be held via Zoom. Please join us if you can and make Juneteenth part of your holiday celebrations for the year 2022!
